# ENERGY SUPPLY IN THE VISEGRAD GROUP'S COUNTRIES

**Dear Colleagues,**

The Visegrad Group (V4) is an association of four Central European countries: Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, and Hungary. The aim of its establishment in the initial phase was to deepen cooperation between these countries, particularly in the matters of joining the European Union and NATO structures. The V4 countries had similar goals of foreign policy and analogous possibilities of its implementation. These former communist bloc states were also best prepared for applying market economy. Furthermore, they represented a comparable level of socio-economic development. The countries of the Visegrad Group are comparable in several aspects, but they can also differ from each other e.g. in terms of energy supply. Energy supply is a significant aspect of the activity of any country, as it determines the operation of the entire economy. The comparisons of the V4 countries may refer to both macroeconomic and microeconomic aspects. It is important to define how the V4 states cope with their energy management, how they go through the energy transition, and in which direction they develop their energy economy. Comparisons analysis may concern the aspects of the use of energy sources, energy security, social and economic aspects of energy, the impact of energy consumption on the environment, and innovative solutions in the energy sector. Besides, the presentation of changes in the energy condition in the V4 countries compared to other developed and developing European countries would be necessary.

## For Authors of monography chapter

Papers with a length of 10 to 12 pages should be sent in the electronic form to the following e-mail address: **monika\_roman@sggw.edu.pl** in .doc or .docx format.

Publications should be prepared in Polish or English.

Editorial requirements:

All Authors are required to submit the publication in a standardized format, which will facilitate our further formatting. The file should fulfil the following requirements:

- font: Times New Roman, size 12pts,
- interline 1.5
- mirror margin of 2.5 cm
- pages numbered
- please don't use italics, bold, caps if it's not really needed
- the article must be prepared for grayscale printing
- all graphs and drawings must be legible (also in grayscale)
- in tables, fonts can be lower than 12 points and single spacing. All cell edges must be visible in basic style and without ornaments
- chapters and subsections must be numbered, however, do not format / highlight them.

In order to prevent cases of ghostwriting and guest authorship, the authors are asked to send a statement to the editor about the participation in the creation of the article. Ghostwriting and guest authorship are manifestations of scientific misconduct. All such events that are detected will be documented and made public.
